REPORT BY CHAIRMAN OF REVENUE COMMITTEE TO STATE COUNCIL EXECUTIVE OF NPANSW FOR THE MEETING ON APRIL 9, 1988

The Revenue Committee was formed because NPA membership fees cover Journal and Newsletter/Walks Program (Branch Allocation) costs only; State Council is dependent on Federal and State Government grants, donations and bequests.

The Committee has held two meetings, on March 14 and March 29. Jeanette Blomfield was appointed Chairman and Sue Bowen Secretary.

At the first meeting, general discussion took place. John Clarke, Jodie Jaye and Jeanette Blomfield had attended a seminar on "Fundraising for Conservation Groups" given by Donna Fletcher, formerly Chief Fundraiser and Membership Officer of the Sierra Club of U.S.A. Extracts from the Sierra Club manual "Grassroots Fund Raising" and jottings from Donna Fletcher's seminar were distributed to the Committee. A copy is attached to this report.

A recommendation by Jeanette Blomfield for a more efficient use of State Council staff was to separate State Council business from Sydney Branch activities. The plan is that at the time of the transfer to the new offices, the staff, premises and facilities should be for the sole use of State Council and its affairs. Sydney Branch should run its branch affairs totally independantly, e.g. its own P.O. box, telephone no., headquarters and staffing. Separation into smaller branches could make it easier to cope with a more manageable number of members. State Council staff would be able to concentrate on the jobs for which they are employed without intrusion or interruption from a Branch of 5,500 members.

At the end of the first meeting, motions were passed recommending that a letter of appeal be sent out asking for donations at the time of membership renewal, and that donations be acknowledged by a thank you letter.

At the second Revenue Committee meeting, discussion centred around the differences in the type of fundraising envisaged for State Council and Branches. State Council fundraising needs to be directed towards (a) appeals to all members for donations to support the aims and objectives of NPANSW, (b) a substantial program seeking bequests, and (c) an increase in NPA membership by advertising and awareness campaigns. Branches need to attract new members too, and to actively fundraise through events rather than the cause (e.g. prizes for raffles, ferry trips, coach trips, stalls, theatre parties, etc). Jodie Jaye suggested an annual springtime National Parks Walkathon, to be organized for the same weekend by all Branches, to raise funds for local issues and to increase awareness of NPA.

The major item discussed was the need for a professional Fundraiser for NPA. John Clarke expressed the opinions that NPA should employ fundraising consultants, and further suggested that we seek donations for a Legal Fund.

The Director, Grahame Wells, related his own personal experience in the Queensland Conservation Council, where fundraising "consultants" turned out to be a front for selling Amway products!

Kate Boyd expressed reservations about employing a Fundraiser on the following grounds (a) that she needed to know more about fundraisers, (b) that the person selected may not be competent enough to even cover their own salary, and (c) that the person selected may not be in tune with the aims and modus operandus of NPA. Kate did however concede that The Wilderness Society, with a NSW membership of 1000, had a full-time Fundraiser who not only covered his own salary but raised considerably more besides, and that a further part-time assistant was contemplated.

The Honorary Treasurer, Linna Arrogante, expressed strongly her opinion that NPA should "bite the bullet" and employ a professional fundraiser to get NPA on a sound financial basis.

Opinions were expressed by Jeanette Blomfield and Jodie Jaye that our Director is competent to select an applicant with suitable qualifications and experience and an outlook compatible with NPA thinking ("not a John Singleton").

A motion was moved by Stephen Lord and seconded by Linna Arrogante that the Revenue Committee recommend to the NPA State Council Executive that a part-time (3 days/week) professional fundraiser be appointed to NPA for an initial period of twelve months. The motion was passed without dissent.

The Director is to be commended for sending out a letter of appeal to all NPA members asking for donations for (1) a Fax machine, (2) publishing of the report "Nature Conservation in Western New South Wales" by Morgan and Terrey, and (3) employment of a Project Officer. The letter follows a request in the March National Parks Journal (page 30) seeking donations for the publishing venture, an offer by Berrima Branch at the March State Council meeting of \$365 (\$1/day for a year) towards a Fax machine provided the balance is made up from other sources, and the passing of a Central Coast Branch motion at the same meeting that a Project Officer be appointed as soon as \$1000 has been raised for this purpose. Donations are already flowing in.

EXTRACTS FROM "GRASSROOTS FUND RAISING", SIERRA CLUB, SANFRANCISCO, USA

Dues dollars just won't stretch far enough.

Branches

A Branch either raises money, or it fails to achieve the goals for which it was founded.

A Branch starts out with two objectives:

(1) Filling the needs of local members by participation in hikes and other activities, information, communication, and a sense of belonging. That means a newsletter of course, a phone, outing schedules.

(2) The other, ultimately overriding, objective is the "conservation" objective. The Branch must take part in, and usually organize and lead local conservation campaigns.

Enough growth and Branches need headquarters.

Fundraising

Direct Appeal (in person, by telephone, or by letter) is best.

Indirect Solicitation - you are marketing an event or product first, and
a cause second.

Fundraising works and it's fun.

Seeing money come in just because you asked for it is fun.

The more you ask for, the more you get.

You must have specific uses for the money.

In a 1977 campaign, individual donors gave 84%, bequests 6%, foundations 5.7%, and corporations 4.5%.

People give at different levels according to their means and their interest in the cause.

You need to get 90% of your donations from 10% of your donors.

Large amounts of money are as easy to raise as small amounts.

JOTTINGS FROM DONNA FLETCHER

A group of people start an organization; membership comes later to raise funds. The best campaigners are often the worst fundraisers.

In letters of appeal, ask first - get the message over in the first 15 seconds. In writing, don't talk to yourself.

"What do you want me to do?"

Always thank people when they join, volunteer, donate.

Talk to committed - don't try to change uncommitted.

Everybody gets the magazine - all are serviced the same.

Members give because of what they believe in, not because of perception by other people.

Annual Report is Number 1 fundraiser to report what has been done.

MEMBERSHIP FEES

Background

1988 Ordinary and Family Membership Fees cover the costs of the National Parks Journal (\$16) and Branch Allowance (\$5.50) with \$1.50 and \$3.50 respectively left over.

The Concession Memberships (Pensioner, Student, Junior) fall short of the Journal plus Branch Allowance by \$7.50.

Thus the surplus from Ordinary and Family Memberships is subsidising Concession Memberships, not the running costs of NPA.

Submission

The present proposal is that Membership Fees be gradually increased over the next four years so that all Memberships will by then cover the costs of Journal plus Branch Allowance, plus an additional amount per member to support the aims and objectives of NPA.

Donations, bequests, grants etc will then be available for additional projects and equipment.

Aim

THAT MEMBERS WILL SUPPORT NPA, NOT THAT NPA SUBSIDISE ITS MEMBERS.







IMPROVEMENTS TO FINANCIAL STRUCTURE

Introduction Since taking over as Treasurer I have observed the operations of NPA and identified some problem areas.

Listed below are a series of recommendations which I believe will bring the Association onto a much better base structurally and financially.

Background. The current structure requires each member to join a Branch, each of which maintains a membership record system. In turn, every month, each Branch must send a return to the State Council Treasurer listing membership changes and paying a capitation fee based on the number of members who joined or paid subscriptions in the previous month.

Prior to the acquisition of the computer, State Council and Sydney Branch kept two records as well: a card system of addresses and financial status and a listing on a mainframe computer for generating journal address labels. Therefore, in effect, each member was listed on three membership records. Two of these were very labour intensive and the third only recorded addresses to which access was only available through an outsider on limited occaisions. These systems were satisfactory when the membership was less than 1000 and only two Branches existed. However with a current membership of over 5000 and 12 Branches, the system has become unwieldly and except for the extreme dedication of a small number of people, almost unworkable. As a result the computer was purchased and although not yet working at its full capacity has the capability to combine all these record systems into one. This will allow us to obtain much better statistical information about our membership and provide for superior financial planning.

Listed below are a series of recommendations and statements.

1. Rationalise membership. "That all NPA membership fees be collected by the State Council Office."

The proposal is that all members join the NPA by paying their

subscriptions direct to the Office or if Branches fear that their membership would suffer, renewals could still be sent to the Branches but forwarded to the Office. In the State Council Treasurer would pay each Branch an operating expenses rebate based on the Branch size as at the 1st January of the current year. The size of this rebate would be adjusted by a number of factors, such as the financial status of the Branch, if a Branch newsletter is sent, the Branch's involvement in local issues or some other appropriate reason.

2. Flexible membership year. "That a flexible membership year be introduced."

With the computer system it is relatively simple to introduce a flexible membership year, i.e a year's subscription lasts 12 months from the date of joining. The current rigid system makes it very difficult for members who join mid-year but pay a full years subscription. Either a refund must be made or credit given for a portion of the following year, both of which entail a lot of paperwork.

Furthermore, in the long term the cash flow will become steadier, whereas with the current system a vast inflow of cash occurs between July and September and a trickle for the remainder of the year. This requires careful planning to avoid overspending and retain financial stability.

3. As part of 2. "That separate renewal notices be sent to each member."

The current system provides for renewal notices to be inserted in the Journal. This often doesn't work as the renewal notice becomes entangled with the advertising insert and can be inadvertently discarded. As a result many memberships are accidentally lost, a situation the NPA can ill afford. With a separate renewal notice it would be less likely to be accidentally disposed of and the psychological effect of receiving it would mean a higher renewal rate which would more than offset the postage and printing costs.

4. Financial year. "That the financial year of the Association be from 1st April to 31st March."

The period from March to May is generally a quiet time for NPA Treasurers and therefore it would be easier to get the financial statements completed. Secondly it would give the NPA more time to produce an annual report and consolidated report for submission to Government departments for grant purposes. These are normally required in July each year.

5. Additional staff. "That State Council employ a membership Services Officer to maintain membership records, answer telephone enquiries and perform some general clerical duties."

Much of the Administrative Officer's time, and in his absence the Director, is taken up in answering membership enquiries.

Consequently much of their time is diverted from their normal duties which results in inefficiency and low morale and means some of their skills are directed away from conservation oriented tasks.

A Membership Services Officer would also be involved in membership promotion and could assist in boosting membership numbers and hence income. Given that the overwhelming majority of membership enquiries made at the Office are for membership of the Sydney Branch it is appropriate that the Sydney Branch be asked to contribute to the salary of the Membership Services Officer.

6. Capitation. "That the capitation fee payable in respect of an ordinary membership be increased by \$3 and that the fees for other classes of membership be raised proportionally."

In 1982/83 the NPA suffered a substantial loss. Much of this was due to the artificially low membership fee which could be kept low by the growth in membership. However, as the growth in membership slowed the fee had to be increased, but to bring it up to a realistic figure would have meant a substantial increase. Therefore it was only put up sufficient just to keep the NPA solvent and when, last year, the membership growth be-ame zero there was no buffer to provide the extra revenue.

To maintain the viability of NPA an increase is needed. To bring the books back to square an increase of at least \$2 is required but to provide a little extra for campaigns a \$3 increase would be preferable. Even though an increase in Govt grants is expected it shouldn't be used to offset subscriptions but used constructively to further the cause of conservation and national parks.

It should be noted that the NPA subs still compare favourably with the ACF and National Trust, both of which produce lower quality journals and provide less services for their members.

7. Budget.

A draft budget is provided overleaf. The points to note include an increase in the Federal Government grant by \$5000 and the provision of \$4000 to assist in the employment of a Membership Services Officer.

8. Conclusion.

Many of these recommendations are controversial and will undoubtedly stir up the feelings of members. However, I believe that if the NPA is to carry out its functions efficiently and effectively tough decisions are required. Many of these recommendations cut across tradition and criticism will be levelled

as to centralising the NPA and reducing the importance of Branches. This is entirely incorrect, the effectiveness of the NPA statewide is due to its Branch network and I am a strong believer in its expansion, not contraction. The basic problem is that the NPA is too big for volunteers to run and almost too big for the two employees, unless the efficiency is substantially improved.

Item 5.1. BRANCH OPERATING FORMULA.

A provision of the new Constitution formally passed by all Branches and approved for implementation at the December 1, 1984, State Council meeting was the payment by members of subscriptions to State Council. This was a significant change from the previous system whereby members paid subs directly to the Branches and the Branches in turn paid a proportion of subs to State Council as a capitation fee payment. As part of the new arrangement is the payment to Branches of an Annual Operating Allowance to assist with Branch expenses.

It was proposed that the operating allowance would be made in two payments, in August and February. An interim formula for the first allowance payment was approved as the September 1984 State Council meeting, and a payment was made to Branches in October. This formula was drawn up to be as equitable as possible and so that Branches would receive approximately the same moneys as they retained under the previous capitation system. There has since been strong criticism of the formula by certain Branches, although no one has come forward with an alternative formula.

The basis of the criticism was that some Branches considered themselves to be worse off financially than they were previously. However, what these Branches have failed to realise is that under the previous system a Branch could ask State Council for a special rebate on their capitation repayment if they were in a financially difficult position and/or were actively engaged in an expensive local campaign. The Branches which received this rebate were Armidale, Clarence Valley, Far North Coast, Illawarra, Tamworth, Mid North Coast and Three Valleys.

Attached is a table which shows the amount of capitation paid by each Branch for the final year of the old system. It can be seen that the money retained by each Branch varied considerably from 94 cents/member for Central West to \$5.59 for Illawarra Branch. The effect of the capitation rebate on the Branches concerned is obvious.

The new system eliminated the capitation rebate and the resultant formula provided a much more uniform payment of moneys to Branches, with the result that some Branches received more and others less. The range of payments varied from \$3.11/member to \$4.20/member, and averaged \$3.52/member.

Another aspect of the criticism was that the formula was unnecessarily complicated.

To overcome these problems a new formula is proposed. Accordingly, I move -

 that a simple formula based on a fixed sum multiplied by the number of memberships of that Branch be adopted for future payments. The formula is as follows:

Annual Operating Allowance = Number of Memberships X A where A is the \$ per member to be paid to each Branch during the current financial year and the figure to be determined at the first State Council meeting held in the new financial year;

- the payment to be made on 1st October of each year and to be based on membership lists current at that time;
- the second payment for 1984/85 be based on the new formula but modified to take into account the moneys already paid;
- 4. the operating allowance per member for 1984/85 be \$4.00;
- this arrangement will not prevent Branches requesting additional funds from State Council if required.
