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The purpose of this letter is to advise you of the status of Council's review of multiple occupancy development. As you will be aware Council prepared and exhibited for public comment a discussion paper identifying the principle land use planning issues and options for change to the planning system managing this form of development. Council then conducted a multiple occupancy workshop inviting those who had made submissions and comments to the discussion paper. On August 22, 1993, Council and senior staff conducted a tour of several multiple occupancy communities in the local government area.

At the September 7, 1993, Ordinary Meeting of Council a planning report was considered by Council. This report reviewed the submissions to the discussion paper, summarised the workshop outcomes, and identified the various planning options available to Council to manage multiple occupancy development. The report also advised Council of the proposed State Government review of State Environmental Planning Policy No. 15 - Multiple Occupancy of Rural Lands.

Council after considering the report, resolved to publicly exhibit it, requesting public comment on planning options proposed with a stated preference of Council to prepare a multiple occupancy policy in the format of a development control plan. Council also resolved to agree in principle to the establishment of a multiple occupancy advisory panel and seek public comment on its composition, structure and terms of reference.

Additionally, Council will shortly commence a survey of multiple occupancies to further develop its information base. The survey will seek information on structures and organisation, social benefits and problems, environmental impacts and impacts on adjoining lands of multiple occupancies.

Please find attached to this letter the September 7 report. As mentioned, Council 's preferred option is to retain and remain with the enabling provisions of SEPP #15 and prepare a supporting policy in a Development Control Plan format. An indicative list of issues that may be addressed by such a policy document are identified. Should you wish to obtain additional copies of the report please contact Malcolm Scott at Council's Offices. In order to minimise excessive printing costs Council provides one complete copy of the report free of charge to those who Council has in the past officially consulted with during the review process. A cover charge of \$5.00 per copy is set for additional copies.

It is proposed that this phase of public consultation will commence September 20, with written submissions to the planning options, advisory panel and other relevant matters closing October 18, 1993 (one month).

STATE ENVIRONMENTAL FLANNING POLICY NO. 15 - MULTIPLE OCCUPANCY AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

I refer to your letter in which the views of the Department are sought with regard to interpretation of the aims and objectives of State Environmental Planning Policy (SEPP) No. 15.

2. The aims and objectives contained in clause 2 of the policy should be read conjunctively, as indicated by the penultimate use of "and". Multiple occupancy developments should therefore be consistent with all of the aims and objectives of the policy.

3. With regard to the Council's assessment of objective (c)(iii), the Department concurs with the view that such an objective is not highly applicable in the Lismore area.

4. The Council may find after further analysis of the capacity of SEPP 15 to address multiple occupancy needs in Lismore, that those needs are best accommodated through an amendment to Lismore LEP 1992. Such an amendment could reflect Lismore's particular land capabilities and servicing capacitles.

5. I hope this information is of assistance.
