"Live up to you promises or face the consequences", was the blunt message for the government from Ian Cohen Green representative in the NSW Upper House. Mr Cohen was speaking to his private members motion demanding the reinstatement of State Environmental Planning Policy 15. "This is the statewide policy that allows for the establishment of communities in rural areas. The policy was originally introduced by the current Premier when he was Minister for Planning in the previous Labor government.

"I'm sick and tired of the government's dilly dallying on this important issue. Prior to the election a number of high profile Labor figures promised that this policy would be reinstated including the minister responsible for the policy Mr Craig Knowles. Eighteen months later nothing has happened", said Mr Cohen.

*Concerned* "This policy is very important in ensuring that there is a low cost housing alternative for people who wish to live in rural communities. Thousands of people who live on existing communities are very ~~concerned~~ because they don't know exactly what their rights are and nor can they expand to meet the needs of increasing populations", continued Mr Cohen.

"Rural communities are of great relevance to the wider society", said Mr Cohen, "because these communities are often the places where ways of living in a greener way have been pioneered. He cited the development of low cost building techniques, especially the use of recycled timber, development of composting toilets, the use of perma-culture and bio dynamic farming, low environmental impact developments and major contributions to the diversity and

culture of rural areas as being some of the results of the rural communities movement."

I refer to your letter of 23 July 1996 seeking further advice concerning the introduction of State Environmental Planning Policy (SEPP) No 15 - Multiple Occupancy of Rural Land. You will recall that I raised the following issues in my response to Cabinet Minute 18-96: the on-site disposal of domestic wastewater, solid waste disposal and the requirement for buffers between incompatible landuse.

I note your proposal that DUAP prepare an explanatory Circular to Councils on the new SEPP which includes "details and reference to the EPA's Draft Environmental and Health Protection Guidelines for the regulation of On-site Wastewater Management Systems for Domestic Households". I also note the intention that advice on solid waste disposal will also be included in the Circular.

Given the potential difficulties associated with the proper disposal of wastes, and the lack of infrastructure in a number of regional areas, I would prefer that these matters be addressed in the SEPP, rather than being left to a Circular which has no legal status. However, if you decide to pursue coverage of these matters via a Circular they will need to be given critical attention in the drafting stage.


The Draft Environmental and Health Protection Guidelines for the regulation of On-site Wastewater Management Systems for Domestic Households referred to in your letter are not Environment Protection Authority (EPA) guidelines. They are being prepared by an inter-governmental committee, consisting of representatives from the EPA, the Department of Health, the Department of Local Government and the Department for Land and Water Conservation. The document is still in draft form and, if the Circular is to be finalised before the guidelines are finalised it may be better to refer to 'current environmental guidelines'.

In relation to the separation of land, it is not clear what the "minor amendment to the SEPP" will entail and/or whether this issue is to be dealt with via the Circular. Again I should stress that the creation and maintenance of appropriate buffers is critically important given the potential for long term problems (particularly the encroachment of urban developments on rural activities) where sufficient separation between uses is not achieved. I would appreciate particularly close collaboration between EPA and DUAP on this aspect of the SEPP revision.

With regard to the need to advance the preparation of the SEPP and Circular and to embark on the consultation process, I support your proposal that the determination of final details be left to our Departmental officers. I have requested that Bernadette O'Connor, Principal Policy Officer, EPA contact Roger Elliott, Acting Divisional Manager (Metropolitan Planning Division) DUAP with a view to finalising the details.

My administration looks forward to the opportunity of providing more detailed input into the draft SEPP 15 and Circular as the matter progresses.

### SEPP 15 - MULTIPLE OCCUPANCY

- The previous Government repealed State Environmental Planning Policy (SEPP 15) - Multiple Occupancy in December 1994.
- The Policy provided for multiple occupancy tenure and use of land to encourage community based and environmentally sensitive lifestyles.
- At the change of Government Legislative Council independents approached me with a view to reinstating SEPP 15.
- The Government has approved my proposal to reintroduce SEPP 15 - Multiple Occupancy of Rural Land.
- However, both the Minister for the Environment and the Minister for Agriculture sought to have additional measures incorporated in the new Policy.
- Letters of consultation were sent to these Ministers on 23rd July, 1996 and a response was received from the Minister for the Environment today. No response has as yet been received from the Minister for Agricultural.
- Once this advice has been received I will give a formal direction under Section 37(2) of the Act to prepare the draft SEPP.
- Once this has been done the Policy will be put on public exhibition for a period of around six weeks and submissions will be taken.
