ICA Melbourne - Extended Family Working Group Report

Once upon a time there was a princess who met a prince, and what happened was a romance leading to a wedding, and they all lived happily ever after.

We have all seen stage, cinema, TV and books based on this theme, and have usually become fascinated with the unfolding plot. Yet, like many myths, this one became very strong in recently past decades, but we sometimes forget to look beyond the wedding. Has happiness become the only goal? The myth seems to infer that happiness and the traditional family unit are virtually synonymous – which they are in some cases.

Today this imagery is being questioned. **Some do not want the commitment of marriage, although there are many people who are looking for long term relationships, but are unclear about how to create them.** Others are not marrying until much later.

Still others are saying that unless there exists a spark of meaningful dialogue, participation in deciding common fields of engagement and a total rethink of male/female roles, they won't be heading towards a wedding or any other form of serious relationship. They say that happiness is elusive and is simply a by-product of other things, or could even be a reflection at some later point in time.

Since January 1996, the group has looked at the writings on the extended family by Margaret Mead, and on single living by Ian Marshall and Cecilia Morris ('A Whole New Way of Life'), evaluating pertinent articles and some contemporary films. The group's task is not to propound or negate various forms of human relationships, but to

unmask some of the past assumptions and work through some of the main issues to do with caring for one's own journey, and the journeys of those around us.

Some of the findings are listed below. However, the subject is extensive and will require additional input before a comprehensive report can be formed.



1. **Most people want to experience a certain significance in their own field of engagement and a sense of participation, particularly if they decide to share that journey with others.**
2. *Creativity and the development of full potential can be found in a number of ways. The nuclear family may be just one of them.*

3. **Creativity is intrinsic to personal development, and hence is an important ingredient in relationships, whether they be between two people or a group.**
4. *The 'energy' of individuals and the relationships around them, depend on deciding and understanding aims, intentions and objectives. Without clarity on these things, there is little 'action' and life can become routine.*
5. **Modern complexity and speed of change make it difficult to define 'fields' for meaningful engagement. Some even experience their lives as slipping and sliding from one field to another, precluding their entering or sustaining relationships of any depth. We ask what is a 'field'? Could it arise because of a major concern? Obviously it is not just a short term happening, but is more likely to be a set of things which one cares about and tries to resolve.**
6. *As our contexts are subject to change, does it mean that in the future relationships should incorporate time limits rather than assume a permanent state? If so, will partnerships need to frequently refocus their common ground to enjoy the high levels of energy and creativity associated with real commitment.*

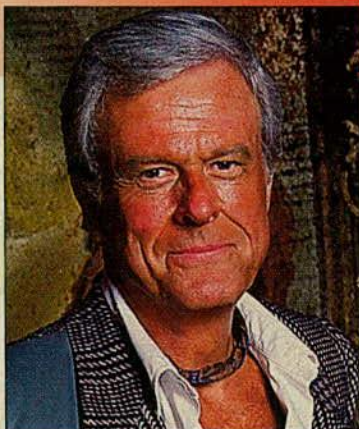

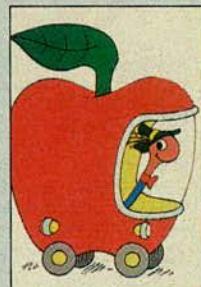

LICENCING COURT JUDGEMENT

set out however that desirable object is outweighed by the public interest issues which I have found in favour of the objectors and for my part I would refuse the application.

CHAIRMAN: The formal order of the court is that by majority the application for the conditional grant of an hoteliers licence is granted subject to the following conditions.

Firstly, the court would formally impose all of those conditions imposed by council in determining the development application. Secondly, it repeats one of those grounds, the standard noise control condition. Namely that the LA10 noise level emitted from the premises shall not exceed the background noise level by more than 5 dBa from 7 am till midnight at any frequency and shall not exceed the background level at any frequency from midnight until 7 am. Measurement is taken at the boundary of the worst affected premises but notwithstanding the compliance with the above the noise from the premises shall not be audible within any habitable room in any premises used for residential purposes between the hours of midnight and 7 am. There will be no amplified juke box and no amplified music or entertainment. The number of approved amusement devices on the premises is limited to two. No credit facilities other than through the conventional credit card facilities. The maximum number of patrons on the premises at any one time is limited to 225 other than on market days. Re: Panasonic Portable Tape Recorder.

I acquired this recorder at a local garage sale. The woman advised me she had it working in Europe but it had not worked since being in Australia.

I suspect the necessary adjustment for the different AC power source may account for this. If there is a fuse to protect against this eventuality, it may have been blown!!

I sent it to a local Byron repair shop & got it back with the message as on the lid together with the enclosed fly wheel and their comment saying that the problem was this broken flywheel and that as a part it was not replaceable.

I am not at ease with this explanation as this does not explain why even with batteries in it there is no indication on the Battery meter and the play function does not work!!

I am delighted with the design and quality of the precision engineering in this recorder. It is for me a joy to behold!

I sense that in its day it was the "state of the art" and the top of the Panasonic range.

Given this I am somewhat suspect about this alleged fly wheel. Its quality seems to be out of character with the rest of the recorder!

The Capstan belt is probably perished by now, but I would suspect a replacement is probably available.

I would appreciate it if you could give me a status report on the problem(s) and if the fly wheel really is the problem, and if it is what options are available, including turning up a replacement.

I would expect to pay for your time in checking this out.

I note the top left hand corner has had a heavy fall. It may be that this has had some impact on the fly wheel or its bearing?

Note the arrangement of the lid opening mechanism and how this is not triggered on the play and record modes.

The wrist strap device is like no other I have seen and I reckon anyone who goes to this degree of precision is unlikely to do sloppy things inside the recorder!

If you are able to have a look at this please give me a ring.

I have no dead line for this, so whenever it is convenient for you is fine by me.
