THE CHANNON COMMUNITY PRECINCT COMMITTEE

ATTITUDE SURVEY RESULTS _ SUMMARY

Our local community precinct committee conducted a survey of all residents of The Channon during July, August and September 1993. The results have just been analysed, and some of the main outcomes are summarised below.

We received a return rate of 28 per cent, representing 420 people (including children) covering a wide cross section of the community - we believe it to be a good representation of the views of the majority of residents in our area.

WHO ARE WE?

By far the majority of people living in The Channon area are in the 30 to 54 age group (47%), while young people (aged 5 to 18) make up 28% of the population.

We are a highly educated community, with 51% of the population having of tertiary qualifications; some sort 19% have university'degrees.

As we suspected, we are also a low income comunity, with 58% of the population earning a household income of less than \$15,000 per year. The unemployment rate is 26%, a figure far above the national average of 11%.

We have only 16% of the population engaged in full-time paid employment, while 40% describe themselves as self-employed. We have 27% of our community involved in artistic or craft work. Nearly a quarter of respondents live on multiple occupancies, while about 60% of people either own their own house outright or have a mortgage.

WHY DO WE LIVE HERE?

The overwhelming response to this question was to appreciate the physical and social environment - the beauty, the climate, the farm life, the clean air; the peace and quiet, the community atmosphere and involvement, the stimulating artistic environment, the proximity to Lismore and the beaches, a great place'to raise children. One person said " I live in the best community in the best place in the best part of Australia and in the best country in the world"!

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HOW COULD IT BE BETTER?

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Most people mentioned better roads. A large number of others wanted an end to divisions in the community. Other subjects mentioned several times included: cleaner creek water, a playground at Coronation Park, more places at the pre-school, better youth facilities, less development and more recycling.

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WHAT DO WE THINK ABOUT:

(A) ROADS?

Not surprisingly, this was the major issue of concern for the majority of respondents. By far the majority of people thought all the roads in the area were either poor or dangerous. More than 60% of people estimated that they spent an extra \$500 or more per year on vehicle maintenance because of the state of the roads we drive on.

As far as action is concerned, 63% responded that they would support some sort of co-operation with Council, such providing labour to assist in repair and maintenance. Many wanted more pressure placed on Council to justify the rates about the amount spent on they charge. Resentment beautification around Lismore was also expresed, while others suggested a rate strike until things change. Another complaint was the poor quality of Council work, particularly when gutters were ignored.

(B) GARBAGE? The overwhelming desire is for a community recycling centre.

(C) YOUTH FACILITIES?

By far the majority of people expressed concern about the issues facing young people in The Channon and called for a youth or sports club here - many suggested a meeting of young people and the precinct committee to hear their ideas.

(D) PUBLIC TRANSPORT? More than half the people responding to the survey said they would use a bus service if it was available, indicating the problem of transport to and from Lismore at night and on weekends and holidays. Some suggested a mini-bus service to run from Nimbin to Lismore via The Channon.

(E) WATER QUALITY?

One-third of people expressed concern about the quality of their drinking water. The major problems expressed were suspected contamination by agricultural sprays, septic tanks and cattle of spring and creek water, while those on town water were concerned about chlorination and other chemicals.

WHAT ARE THE PRIORITIES FOR THE PRECINCT COMMITTEE? Roads, roads, roads! Followed by water quality, community facilities, walkway to the oval and garbage. Other frequently mentioned issues were: looking at dip sites, a playground at the oval and outside the shop, less spraying, formation of more Landcare groups, an end to divisions in the community, a bike track and a swimming pool.
