

AGM TREASURERS REPORT

The last financial year for the NCEC saw a modest increase in our Government Grant of \$2188 taking it to \$10188. NCEC received a grant of \$8000 to hold the National Conference of Conservation Councils and Environment Centres at Coffs Harbour in May 1994.

The financial year of 1992-93 saw a budget surplus but the leat financial year saw a budget deficit of \$302 due to the NCEC taking legal action against the export of woodchips. This cause was undertaken late in the financial year after most of the budgetary allocation for grants to member groups and legal costs had been given out. Nevertheless, it was necessary to dip into our \$2000 reserve to mount this woodchip challenge.

Subscriptions have lagged behind over previous years but member groups are now subscribing to their commitments.

The NCEC has been awarded tax deductability status is now deemed to have charity status. This is a great boost to our credibility as an important community organisation. This allows us to be more attractive as a fundraiser to participate in environmental issues. It is now up to member groups to impress upon their members and friends to start donating any of their excess funds to the NCEC and to use our tax deductability advantage.

#### Notes on Draft Budget 91/92

- 1. This request for an increase in the Federal grant is made on the grounds that the workload of the Council has increased by at least 50% in the past nine months.

  The Council has responded to two House of Rep. Inquiries one of the Coast and the other on Biological Diversity.

  It made a large submission to the Resources Assessment Commissions Inquiry into Forestry and the Timber Industry annd will be doing so with the Coastal Inquiry.

  The Council has also made submissions on such national issues as the plan of management for World Heritage area in Tasmania, mining in National Parks in Western Australia, and has called for the Great Sandy Area of Queensland to become a World Heritage area.

  In NSW the Council has managed to bring both the Federal and State Governments attention to what it considers mismanagement of National Rainforest Conservation Program funds.

  The Council is preparing a submission to the discussion paper prepared by DASETT on the Minimisation of Waste and the Council made a submission to the Industries Commission on Paper Recycling. The Ecological Sustainability Working papers will be examined and commented on by the Council.

  Council is involved with Strategic Transport Studies which are funded by the Federal Government and has made comment of energy studies.

  There are a number of issues which though concerning North Coast land use are matters of great concern to all Australians many of whom spend holidays on this coast or visiting the World Heritage rainforesat areas.

  On the present grant the Council and the community rely solely on volunteers for all the Council activities we consider that the grant should really be increased to enable part time employment of some persons to deal with the dozens of issues arising on this rapidly urbanising part of Australia.
- 2. Mail and phone costs are increasing with the work load and there is to be a postage rate increase
- 3. The work load is causing the increase of this iutem
- 4. The area covered by the Council measures 350 km by 100 km and though meetings are held in different locations to ease problems of travel there are costs involved for most members. Council only pays ten cents a kilometre for travel so members are well out of pocket in attending meetings and as well they meet all their own food and where necessary accommodation costs. The increase in work load has resulted in more meetings.
- 5. This is for Members who have been placed on other Committees and for who there is no provision to meet travel costs
- 6. Grants are made to Members bodies for help in special circumstances to purchase equipment, to meet an unexpected cost.Often such grants are made in the form of loans

#### NEW PLAN SECURES KURNELL

.14 JUL 1989

The Minister for Local Government and Minister for Planning, Mr David Hay, today released the Regional Environmental Plan for the Kurnell Peninsula which completely changes the future direction of development in the area.

"The plan now zones 70 per-cent of the Peninsula for open space, deleting the former Offensive and Hazardous Industry Zone relating to toxic industry - an area of contention in the area for many years," Mr Hay said.

"The REP makes a very considerable improvement in the zoning situation as the zones included in the Plan will significantly reduce the potential impact from industrial development. Future uses on the Kurnell Peninsula will now have an emphasis on tourism and open space."

In line with the Government's commitment to further improve the environmental quality of the Peninsula, Mr Hay has directed the Department of Planning commence a review of the remaining industrial lands at Kurnell to determine what future alternative land uses may be appropriate.

"Dependent on the outcome of this review, the REP will probably be amended to even further diminish the effects of industrial development in the future," Mr Hay said.

The release of the plan was welcomed by the Member for Cronulla, Malcolm Kerr.

## PRESIDENTS REPORT FOR THE 9TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE NORTH COAST ENVIRONMENT COUNCIL.

The North Coast Environment Council has successfully fulfilled its role as the coordinating body of the conservation movement of the North Coast from 1977 to the present day. Next year will be the 10th anniversary and we should endeavour to trace all former members for a reunion to celebrate this event. Those who have been active in the Council have all contributed greatly to the environmental movement. Each committee member and delegate are representative of grass roots activity in their own area.. It is always an inspiration for me to attend an N.C.E.C. meeting because those present are such vibrant environmental activists with so much talent and energy. It was therefore with much sadness that this year we lost two of our colleagues for the environment. Peter dan Exter and Col Davies- in their own way both have left an indellible mark on us and their contribution to the environment will always be remembered.

#### MEETINGS

This year we have held three meetings of the Council at Yarra-hapinni, Red Rock and Lismore. All of these have generated lively debate and action on the following;

#### PLANNING

Member groups have had imput into Shire environmental and local environmental plans and as well an N.C.E.C. delegate has participated in the Regional Environmental Plan. Some of the local issues have included the following;

Red Rock - inappropiate planning and water reticulation proposala which the ratepayers do not want. Recently featured on the ABC T.V programme the Investigators.

Tweed Shire - has had a myriad of planning problems with a local government investigation into the Shires affairs. Court action is proceeding against a developer for breaking S.E.P.P. No 14 wetlands protection area.

Byron Shire - a D.A. for the Cape Byron International Acadamy has left many unanswered questions.

Coffs Harbour - Foreshore development stalled.

Bellingen - South Urunga Developement plan has generated good public participation against a 400 ha developement geared to promote real estate.

Nambucca - Wetland areas shallenged by Freehold landowners assocat an inquiry on the Rural Plan, and defended by Three Valleys N.F.A and Nambucca Valley Association.

#### STATE GOVERNMENT

The introduction of the S.E.P.P. No 14 Wetlands Protection and the Littoral Rainforest Policy were the results of intense lobbying throughout the years by this Council. This Council acknowledges the work of the minister for Flanning and Environment Mr Bob Cerr in both these policies.

#### FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

without a doubt the recent Budget pronouncement that the Government would resume salling uranium to France represented an alienation of the federal government from the Environmental and the grass roots levels of the Labor: party. This council telegramed its disgust at the decision.

What a pity that the Labor Government that has been supportive of the Environmental movement through financial grants to councils such as ours, should risk its political future by such an action, unfortunately the oppositions policy would be the same.
