- Assisting voluntary wildlife conservation -

The role of the Bush for Wildlife national coordinator is to support and encourage the conservation of wildlife habitats on private and public land, particularly in rural areas.

Wildlife habitats provide food, shelter and other essentials of life for Australia's native species. Habitats occur across the landscape, from conservation reserves such as national parks, to private land used for agriculture or other purposes.

Some species are only found in remnant native vegetation or wetlands on private land, or public land managed by local government. These species depend on <u>conservation outside</u> reserves.

Farmers, bush block owners, indigenous communities, local governments, businesses and non-government organisations are increasingly managing land for conservation. As they manage about two-thirds of Australia's land-mass, their role is critical.

All States and Territories have schemes to <u>assist landholders</u> interested in conserving native species and wildlife habitats on their land.

Landholders and communities, working with government and non-government organisations, are essential to the continued survival of our wildlife.

Many individuals, groups and organisations manage land for conservation, or can offer assistance to those that do. To find out more about the types of landowners and managers working in nature conservation, go to the 'land managers' page.

Some landowners may wish to manage their land for conservation, but not be bound by formal arrangements or time periods. They may wish to keep their options open for the future management of that land. Others may wish to ensure permanent protection of their land, and will enter into statutory conservation covenants, which are legally binding, even if the land is sold.


Permanent conservation covenants are desirable for land of significant conservation value. Holders of such covenants are also more likely to attract financial incentives and grants for conservation work. At the same time, any commitment to conservation is valued.

All States and Territories offer various types of schemes to suit the landowner's level of interest and commitment. Such schemes range from non-binding, through binding for an agreed period, to land being committed to permanent protection for conservation purposes.

### Assistance provided under voluntary conservation schemes can include:

- · property assessment: to identify the habitat types and quality;
- · survey and monitoring: of plants, animals, ecological communities;
- management and technical advice: to retain and enhance habitats for wildlife;
- farm planning: to identify best management practices for different zones;
- help to integrate conservation with other land uses;
- financial assistance (eg for fencing, weed control): to help protect and maintain habitats;
- rate rebates in some council areas: to assist landholder contributions to conservation;
- access to other funding sources: advice on available grants, help with applications;
- links with other landholders (newsletters, field days): interchange of ideas, experience, expertise.
