PROXY FORM FOR NCOSS AGM 2003

EXTRACT FROM THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

Each corporate member in the absence of a delegate may, in writing, appoint a proxy, a member of its own organisation to attend, speak and vote, at general meetings. Such appointment shall be signed on behalf of a corporate member by its Secretary, President, or principal executive officer.

Each associate (individual) member may in writing, appoint a proxy to attend and vote at general meetings.

Any instrument appointing a proxy must be delivered to the office of the Council not less than fortyeight hours before the time for holding the meeting or an adjourned meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposed to vote and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be valid.
