The Hamilton free Vision Stereoscopic Viewing Box

- 1. Approach the viewing window so the tip of your nose is about a hand width from the centre of the Viewer Box.
- 2. Close the <u>left eve</u> and adjust the head so that the <u>right eve</u> is seeing the whole of the <u>left hand picture</u>.
- 3. Holding the head I this position, <u>close the right eye</u> and <u>open</u> <u>the left eye</u>. If necessary adjust the head position so that the <u>right eye sees the left picture</u> and <u>left eye sees the right</u> <u>picture</u>.
- 4. Holding the head in this position open **both eyes.** "Allow' the pictures to "merge". If the top petals are not aligned horizontally, tilt the head slightly to the left or right so that they do align horizontally. "Look for the "depth" in the combined image. If this does not immediately appear try "blinking" the eyes.
- 5. Note where the tip of the Orchid is in relation to the window frame. Slowly moving the head <u>back</u> will bring the Orchid <u>forward of the viewing window</u>.
