Add a line

- 1 On the **Drawing toolbar**, click **AutoShapes**, point to **Lines**, and then click the line style you want.
- 2 Drag to draw the line.
To constrain the line to draw at 15-degree angles from its starting point, hold down SHIFT as you drag.
To lengthen the line in opposite directions from the first end point, hold down CTRL as you drag.

Tip If you just want to draw a straight line, click **Line**  on the **Drawing toolbar**.

Place cursor where you may want a line top & bottom
{ In "Tables & Borders" (Top Toolbar  highlight). This produces an extra toolbar at the below "File" etc. }
Select line weight  and "point size"
Select "Top Border" box . Click ~~and~~ line required.
• change box to "Bottom Border" & repeat.
